"Not being able to go out with the pandemic Covid 19 in my opinion, the first time in March 2020 I found it quite hard not being able to go out.


Not going out to do my weekly shopping, going to the gym at Folkestone sports centre.

#### 5. What's your favourite movie?


My favourite movie is the Labyrinth, it has been my favourite since I was a child.

## **RECIPE OF THE QUARTER**

Sharon Todd – Burnham Manager has chosen her delicious 'Cheese Scone' recipe, serves 6.

#### Ingredients

225g self-raising flour, plus extra to dust • 1 tsp baking powder • 1/2 tsp salt • 1/2 tsp cayenne pepper • 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp mustard powder • 55g chilled salted butter, cubed • 100g mature cheddar, finely grated, plus 50g grated • 60ml warmed mixture of whole milk and water, plus extra milk for brushing • Add some chilli flakes if you like things hot!

#### Method

- Put the baking sheet in the oven and heat it to 220°C/200°C fan/gas 7.
- Meanwhile, sift the flour, baking powder, salt, cayenne pepper and mustard powder the mixture resembles very fine breadcrumbs.
- Using a large mixing bowl (if it's not already in one), mix in the 100g finely grated cheese.
- Add the milk and water mixture to the bowl and using a dinner knife with a cutting knead it.
- Gently press out the mixture to 2.5cm thick. Cut out 4 scones using your cutter. Gently press the offcuts together and cut out 2 more scones.
- Brush the tops of the scones with milk and sprinkle with the remaining 50g grated apart, then bake for 12-14 minutes until richly golden and cooked through.
- Remove the scones from the oven and serve as soon as possible after baking, ideally smoked salmon.

The scones are best eaten warm the day they are made but will keep in an airtight container for up to 24 hours or in the freezer for up to 1 month. Defrost thoroughly.
